Dr. Kulin Kothari welcomed all the members and expressed condolences on the demise of a member of the Board of Advisors, Late Shri Manubhai Shah.

He gave a presentation on the status of the various projects and activities of VFI.

The highlights were as follows:

Project 'Rashtriya Netra Yagna'- Last year VFI had facilitated 1,17,574 free eye surgeries under this project. State-wise data of these eye surgeries were presented, 20% of which were done in the state of Maharashtra.

Other Projects- A brief update on all major projects such as Mumbai Urban Slum Eye Care (MUSE) Project, Project Police Jyoti, Village Adoption Project and Inauguration of Project Sugar n Sight (National Diabetic Retinopathy Project) was provided. He thanked Shri A. N. Roy for his support with the MUSE & Police Jyoti projects

Dr. Kulin Kothari also informed the members about the recent strategic meetings held to discuss the way forward for the Foundation as follows:

- a. A day long brainstorming meeting was conducted on 8th July'18 at Mumbai with experts from all over India. The experts were Prof. (Dr.) B. R. Shamanna (Hyderabad), Prof. Dr. Praveen Vashist (New Delhi), Dr. Uday Gajiiwala (Gujarat), Mr. Prashant (Karnataka) and Dr Narayan Bordoi (Assam).
- b. On 26th July'18, Dr. Kulin Kothari along with VFI management team met Dr. Anand Bang, Medical Advisor to the Chief Minister of Maharashtra, on how the foundation can partner with the Maharashtra government for achieving the objective of eradicating curable blindness in the State of Maharashtra. The project will be officially called into action through a letter from the Honorable Chief Minister.





The 5th Advisory Board & Trustees Meeting was held on Saturday, 28th July 2018 at Piramal Tower, Mumbai.



Dr. Kulin Kothari presented the new initiatives being undertaken and sought support from the members for the same:
a) He shared a proposal document providing details on the project model for Project Sugar N Sight including the idea of using Artificial Intelligence (AI). The AI technology is being developed by a team of professionals.

- b) He sought support from the members to use their good offices to connect other corporates to the foundation for their CSR activities. Shri Ajay Piramal emphasized that the district adoption project can interest many corporates to join hands.
- c) He once again sought Shri Piyush Pandey's expertise to help with the branding and positioning of the foundation.

Dr. Saumil Kothari summarized the discussions and concluded the meeting with a vote of thanks to all the members and specially thanked Shri Ajay Piramal for hosting the meeting at the Piramal board room.


Working with the Vision Foundation of India & BCEIRC since more than 30 years, SADHANA BHATIA is a multi-talented individual who is actively involved in administration.
